labor for all service calls.

Vital signs need to be checked regularly to keep all your plumbing flowing in the right direction. So much can be determined by taking your house water pressure and temperature, and testing the water heater flue draft. Water heaters are the number one cause for carbon monoxide poisoning! These test are all part of your

FACTS:

- Skin can burn at 130 degrees. Keep your water heater set at 125 degrees or less. If it's over 130 degrees, have your body temperature check by a professional ASAP!
- Normal house water pressure is 30 to 80 psi or ideally 45 to 60 psi. If it's over 80, it could damage valves and leak excessively.
- You can purchase a simple water pressure gage and thermometer at your local hardware store.
